



REPORT ON THE TRAINING VISIT TO JAGIELLONIAN UNIVERSITY IN KRAKOW (POLAND)

24th - 27th September, 2014

General data:

As planned, the last training visit to one of FUSE TEMPUS Project EU partners was the one to JAGIELLONIAN UNIVERSITY IN KRAKOW (POLAND). It was carried out in the period from 25-26 September (i.e. from 24th through 27th May, including the journey), 2014.

Objectives:

The aim of the training Visit were the activities related to WP1 and WP2, in particular activities 1.2. and 2.1:

- DEV WP1 Developing administrative and legal conditions for improved university support services and procedures (Activity 1.2 Reviewing the models of EU partners' relevant legal and administrative framework),
- DEV WP2 Fostering various support services (academic mobility support, IT support, marketing and information activities) (Activity 2.1 Analysing current practices in academic mobility services at EU partners, and establishing / enhancing them).

- 2) presentations of JU international office and Students International Office, Department of Admissions, and International Research Office, focusing on procedures of amission, IT support and coordination between central and faculty units
- 3) presentations related to the role of languages for university internationalization (university language centers, study programmes in foreign languages, center for Polish language and culture, working with multinational groups of students)
- 4) a workshop related to trends and challenges in internationalization of higher education

All the given presentations and the related activities (listed in the Training Visit Agenda) were interactive, i.e. all of them offered the entire FUSE Team from Serbia a exceptional opportunity for fruitful discussion with our JU partners, for exchange of ideas and for sampling examples of good practice and problem solutions, pertaining to the abovementioned areas the given Training Visit was organized within.

Prior to this, and immediately following the training visit, the participants from each of the Serbian partner institutions filled in the WP1 and WP2 Questionnaires, Part B and Part C, with the training visit-related information and especially their recommendations for the improvements at their home institutions. The Questionnaires are submitted to WP Leaders at UKG and UNS, and will serve as the basis for the final joint report.
